Winter Wonders 2025: Brussels weaves its solidarity and creative connections



From 28 November 2025 to 1 January 2026, the City of Brussels is celebrating the 24th edition of Winter Wonders (continuing on Place De Brouckère until 4 January 2026).

Every winter, Brussels lights up to celebrate the Christmas season and the magic of the holidays. With its blend of revisited traditions, contemporary creations and friendly atmosphere, Winter Wonders reflects the spirit of a united, warm and inventive capital city. The event forges links between artisans, associations and residents, while showcasing Brussels' heritage, culture and expertise.

Winter Wonders, a cultural, economic, and community event all at once, is a genuine driving force for the capital. With over 4 million visitors in 2024 and an estimated economic impact of €260 million for the hospitality, catering, retail, entertainment, and transport sectors, it serves as a catalyst for local development and an excellent showcase for Brussels. With its charming wooden chalets, emblematic attractions, and constantly updated entertainment programme, it promotes social connections while also supporting the city's craft, tourism, and cultural fabric.

The 2025 edition promises to be dazzling, generous, and resolutely Brussels in spirit. The market is adopting a new layout designed to ensure greater comfort for visitors, while new artistic and cultural collaborations further underline the presence of the city's stakeholders: from the artist Stephan Goldrajch, creator of the 2025 visual identity, to the designer Jean-Paul Lespagnard, for the Christmas tree on Grand-Place.

At all the sites, Winter Wonders celebrates the power of community and local cohesion. Its collaborations and partnerships with cultural institutions, associations, and local partners — from the Royal Theatre of La Monnaie to Food Banks, including **Imaginaires**Publics, STIB, and Maisons de quartier (community centres) — embody this shared energy powering the capital's beating heart.

Rooted in the city and aimed at all audiences, Winter Wonders 2025 invites you to rediscover Brussels in a bright and human light: a creative, festive and lively capital.



The 2025 posters: when Brussels knits its winter ties...

Through **Stephan Goldrajch**'s poster, Brussels reveals itself as a living network of colours, textures and faces – a metaphor for the social ties and collective creativity that animate each edition of Winter Wonders.

By entrusting the creation of the visual to this Brussels artist, the City of Brussels and Brussels Major Events are affirming their desire to explore new media and celebrate the diversity of local talent. Far from traditional graphic approaches, this edition asserts a poetic, artisanal and deeply human sensibility.

Stephan Goldrajch's work combines crochet, weaving, embroidery and sewing, transforming these gestures into a collective language. His work invites us to knit links, bring differences together and build shared forms of beauty.

Wool – a symbol of warmth, transmission and gathering – thus becomes the common thread of Winter Wonders 2025. It embodies the very spirit of the event: creating connections in the heart of the city, bringing residents and visitors together in a spirit of conviviality, creation and sharing.

For five weeks, 238 craftworkers and traders present treats for the eyes of the curious and titillate the taste buds of food lovers. Visitors can savour world cuisine, discover original creations, and unearth the perfect gift to give or keep.

The 2025 edition of Winter Wonders follows in the footsteps of the work undertaken in recent years to revise the layout. Led by Brussels Major Events, this project aims to improve the fluidity of movement, the coherence of the route, and the comfort of residents and stallholders.

At the same time, **new partnerships** have been formed and others renewed to strengthen ties with those who contribute year-round to **Brussels' cultural and economic vitality**. It is only fitting that they are part of an event that celebrates **local creativity, conviviality, and sharing**.

Redesigned to ensure **fluid circulation and harmonious cohabitation**, the market perfectly embodies the ambition to create dialogue between festive energy and daily life — while showcasing the diversity of craftsmanship and the spirit of openness that define the capital.

The Christmas market

Place de la Monnaie

This year, Place de la Monnaie will be lit up with an increased number of chalets offering food, gifts and entertainment for all visitors.

As an extension of this festive site, a monumental upcycled structure, designed in collaboration with the Théâtre Royal de La Monnaie, will host nine Christmas trees made from recycled materials, each representing a craft workshop and reflecting expertise in scenography and reuse. The trees are decorated during participatory workshops, open to the general public and schoolchildren, and a glass container recreates a La Monnaie workshop, offering a glimpse into the process of making sets, costumes and props.

On one hand, visitors will be able to **explore behind the scenes** of the opera through the
temporary exhibition of the Ateliers de la Monnaie,
discovering how sets, costumes and props are
made.

On the other hand, **contribute to the creation of a huge Christmas tree**, by participating in the opera house's craft trades: carpentry, sewing, tapestry or ironwork.

Also, they will **discover local heritage and creativity** by exploring the theatre and temporary exhibition spaces, where history, art and craftsmanship come together.

Fish Market (Vismet)

The Vismet or Fish Market, the lively heart of the Christmas market, is undergoing a significant redevelopment this year. The aim is to relieve congestion in this area between the Quai aux Briques and the Quai au Bois à Brûler, in order to improve traffic flow for the public.

Here you will find chalets offering savoury and sweet treats, as well as original gifts.

Between purchases, you can enjoy a variety of entertainment, such as the Ferris wheel, which offers a breathtaking view of the market.



In the heart of Winter Wonders, the Stella Artois Pavilion continues to welcome visitors in a friendly atmosphere, inviting them to savour this local beer during what has become an unmissable event.

Place De Brouckère

The ice rink and curling rinks remain in Place De Brouckère, with no major changes.

The area in front of the administrative building will host an attraction previously located at Vismet: ball fishing, which will complement the site's other fun activities.





The Bourse's site also illustrates Winter Wonders' desire to forge links through solidarity and creative initiatives, in collaboration with committed Brussels stakeholders.

Among these is the Bar à Tricot, located in the Agora space of the Bourse and run by the non-profit organisation Waka-Up. This participatory and friendly place invites the public to knit, crochet, chat over a cup of fair trade coffee or tea, and discover handcrafted creations.

Two fair trade chalets also take turns hosting Brussels associations working to promote solidarity and social cohesion, while a photo exhibition by Kevin Laloux highlights those who drive this great fabric of connections.

Place de la Bourse

During the weekend of 13 and 14 December, the Bourse will become a hub of local creativity with the fourth edition of Creators Factory. More than fifty creators will take over the majestic nave of the Bourse, an ideal historical setting to showcase talent, innovation and sustainability.

For the first time over two days, the nave will also host the Entreprenoires Winter Market, which brings together around twenty Belgian female entrepreneurs. The two events coexist and collaborate to offer visitors a rich and varied experience. Among the activities at the Entreprenoires Winter Market, a Solidarity Tombola will be organised, with the proceeds going to a local association.

Together, these markets transform the Bourse into a hub of creativity, craftsmanship and innovation, offering a unique opportunity to discover and support Brussels talent.

Espace Vanderborght (Rue de l'Étuve) hosts its Creators Market from 28 November to 14 December, Thursday to Sunday, with activities such as Art Truc Troc and Fashion Days, highlighting the vitality and ingenuity of Brussels creators.

Le Continental hosts its Winter Market from 12 to 14 December, a welcoming space that prolongs the festive experience, enabling visitors to discover new talent in an accessible setting.

Plaisirs d'Hiver artisan quality label

The City of Brussels offers local and foreign craft specialists a real commercial showcase through Winter Wonders.

Thirty-five chalets display the Quality Label, a distinctive mark guaranteeing the quality and origin of the products.

Each of these markets has its own specific personality, but together they form a weekend of discoveries, responsible purchases, and encounters with local creativity. In this way, Place de la Bourse reaffirms its role as an economic and cultural crossroads, where gastronomy, crafts, and innovation converge in the heart of Brussels.

Place Sainte-Catherine

Place Sainte-Catherine maintains its traditional offering with its unmissable Andrea's Merry-Go-Round and gastronomic chalets.

Tour Noire

Behind **Sainte-Catherine Church**, the **Tour Noire site** reaffirms its identity as a key destination for parents and children.

This year, a "Candy Cane" design will turn the area into a magical, recognisable setting. This new scenography will offer a new visual identity, turning it into an authentic family village at the heart of Winter Wonders.

Madeleine

The square in front of the Madeleine Chapel will host chalets run by Ukrainian associations, offering culinary specialities and souvenirs from the region.

A mini Christmas village at Place Poelaert

Nestled at the foot of the Ferris wheel, Place Poelaert is hosting a mini Christmas village with a new twist this year. This new space invites visitors to take a gourmet break in a warm atmosphere, enjoying sweet treats, comforting drinks and an exceptional view of Brussels.

Designed as a place for sharing and solidarity, the site also houses a toy collection area for sick or disadvantaged children, which will be redistributed by Brussels associations.

This festive and generous project has been made possible thanks to the support of Carrefour, through its unique concept "The Box", a temporary pop-up combining a tasting area and civic engagement.

Grand-Place in all its splendour



Inauguration: Friday 28/11 from 6 p.m.

This opening night will transform the heart of the capital into an open-air stage where light, music and shared emotions will come together in a warm and distinctly Brussels atmosphere. With magical scenery, artistic performances and moments of conviviality, this celebration will mark the start of an edition dedicated to creativity, heritage and collective magic.

On the Grand-Place, the show will begin in darkness. Silence precedes wonder: huge luminous birds rise, carried by a laser ballet and monumental mapping that dresses the tower of the Town Hall and its facades with colourful graphic animations. The highlight of the evening will be the lighting of the large Christmas tree and the new nativity scene, designed by Brussels artists.

A choir will then set the tone for the evening and accompany the audience from one iconic location to another, weaving a thread of sound between the different event sites.

In the courtyard of the Town Hall, the immersive installation Morphosis will complete this sensory experience, inviting visitors to contemplate nature at the heart of heritage.

The Grand-Place, the symbolic heart of Winter Wonders, is reinventing itself this year with two creations that bring heritage and innovation together.

Alongside the majestic Christmas tree, designed under the direction of designer Jean-Paul Lespagnard, a new poetic and contemporary nativity scene by Victoria-Maria, an interior designer based in Brussels, is unveiled.

A Christmas tree designed by a Brussels-based creator

An essential symbol of Winter Wonders, the majestic Christmas tree stands in the heart of Brussels' Grand Place. Every year, it attracts millions of visitors who come to admire its splendour and festive atmosphere.

Under the artistic direction of Jean-Paul
Lespagnard, the tree has been reinvented
this year, becoming a link between tradition,
creativity and civic engagement. Its carefully
designed decorations celebrate the diversity and
conviviality of the capital, while highlighting local
solidarity.

After the festive season, the tree will be recycled and its decorations auctioned off to raise money for food banks. This initiative allows everyone to make a concrete contribution to supporting people in need and combating food waste, while promoting craftsmanship and civic engagement.

The project is supported by Delacre, a historic Brussels biscuit manufacturer, which supports this approach of generosity and sustainability. The true heart of Winter Wonders, the tree transforms the Grand-Place into a place of shared wonder, where light, art and solidarity come together to remind us of what is most precious about the festive season: the pleasure of being together.




Les Étoffes de la Nativité come to life in a new nativity scene


The Grand Place welcomes a new creation for the Winter Wonders nativity scene: Les Étoffes de la Nativité, a poetic installation by Victoria-Maria, a Brussels-based interior designer acclaimed by the international press for her refined and daring style.

Housed in a translucent greenhouse measuring 6.5 metres long, 3.5 metres wide and 4 metres high, inspired by the Royal Greenhouses of Laeken, this light structure acts as a bell of light and softness, a cross between nomadic tents and the starry sky.

In the centre, life-size rag dolls, dressed in colourful, folkloric fabrics – linen, satin and velvet from end-of-line stocks or recycled materials – embody a handcrafted and accessible Nativity scene, paying homage to Belgian textile expertise.

Designed with Span Tech (structure and fabric) and L'Atelier by Souveraine (textile manufacturing and characters), the installation combines lightness, sustainability and technical ingenuity.





For several years now, Brussels Major Events has been supporting the development of local cultural and creative industries and regularly contributes to the emergence of innovative projects such as Morphosis.

The courtyard of the Town Hall hosts a monumental installation that explores transformation and metamorphosis.

Hybrid figures, moving avatars, changing identities: the work questions our relationship with the body, animals, plants, simulacra and algorithms, where the real and the virtual merge. During the day, it offers a sound and visual experience and comes to life at nightfall.

Designed for public spaces, Morphosis is based on a giant zoetrope, a circular device that creates the illusion of movement through a succession of animated images. Artist Rocío Álvarez, invited by the Interval.ooo studio, unfolds

a colourful and poetic universe, combining illustration, animation and fragmented narration, inviting visitors to wander and contemplate.

This hybrid work offers a sensory and immersive experience where the intimate meets the collective, where contemporary art dialogues with the transformations of society. It is part of the Imaginaires Publics call for projects, funded by the Government of the Wallonia-Brussels Federation and operated by ST'ART, in collaboration with Wallonia-Brussels International (WBI).

Echoes of Colours, a ballet of light and colour on the Grand-Place

Every winter, Brussels' Grand-Place is illuminated by a visual and sound show that has become emblematic of the Plaisirs d'Hiver winter festival. For the 2025 edition, the City of Brussels is presenting a creation by Camille Gross, Olivier Magermans and Sébastien Riquelme, produced by Electroson Studio and presented with the support of Proximus.

The show opens with a unique two-minute laser sequence, specially designed for the Grand Place: a ballet of beams, volumes and rhythms of light that envelops the audience in a vibrant atmosphere.

This is followed by the video mapping Echoes of Colours, a five-minute projection on the tower of the Town Hall. In this dreamlike universe, colour becomes matter and light: the façade fragments, becomes fluid, is covered with phosphorescent vegetation before exploding in a final symphony of colours and sounds.

Combining art, storytelling and technology, this double show renews the Grand-Place experience by celebrating the evocative power of light and contemporary creation.

By supporting this initiative, Proximus invites the public to disconnect and fully enjoy all the magical moments of the end of the year.



















Visits of the City Hall

An unmissable site in Brussels, the Town Hall invites you on a journey to the very heart of the capital's heritage and history. As soon as you set eyes on the flamboyant Gothic silhouette from Grand-Place, you are drawn into an interactive exploration of six centuries of architecture, art, and traditions.

In 23 stages, up monumental staircases, through ornate chambers and iconic halls, every corner reveals a new aspect of the city's history. Armed with your video guide, explore the route at your own pace, whether you are a history enthusiast, an art lover, or a family looking for adventure.

This visit transforms a historic landmark into a living, poetic experience, in which the past and present of Brussels come together in a fascinating dialogue accessible to all.

Climb the 200 spiral steps of the City Hall's tower and watch as Brussels unfolds beneath your feet. Along the way, take a break in an intimate area, turned into a magical passageway that poetically transports visitors to the very heart of Brussels' heritage, accompanied by an original musical creation.

As you ascend, light and sound combine subtly to awaken the senses and invite wonder, before reaching the 360° panoramic view, offering a unique view of the Grand Place, the large Christmas tree and the entire illuminated city.

Unmissable attractions





(Place De Brouckère)

The Winter Wonders ice rink is back on Place De Brouckère and will remain open until Sunday 4 January.

A special area has been set up for toddlers, allowing them to discover the ice in complete safety. Skates that attach to shoes are available to help them learn. The ice rink is fully accessible to wheelchair users and their companions, both on and off the ice.

Curling (Place De Brouckère)

To relive the spirit of winter sports in the heart of Brussels, three curling rinks have been set up in front of the ice rink on Place de Brouckère, offering visitors the opportunity to try their hand at this friendly game that is accessible to all.

The Lotto Ferris Wheel... place your bets! (Vismet)

From atop the 55 metres of one of the most spectacular attractions of Winter Wonders, the view of Brussels and its festive city centre is out of this world. The 42-cabin Ferris wheel also provides persons with reduced mobility with a cabin specially adapted to their needs.

Andrea's carousel (Place

Sainte-Catherine)

On Place Sainte-Catherine, Andrea's Carousel, populated by fantastical characters handcrafted in the poetic universe of Jules Verne, offers visitors a moment suspended in time.

The Virtual Reality Dome

(Boulevard Anspach)

Comfortably seated in enveloping chairs mounted on jacks, visitors to the VR Dome are immersed in virtual reality adventures: encounters with mummies or dragons, exploration of a haunted house, space trave or a Christmas sleigh ride... Spectacular experiences accessible to all ages.

Santa's reindeer

(Boulevard Anspach)

This **Giant Santa Claus** can carry up to 32 people in its reindeer- and sleigh-shaped gondolas. Reaching a maximum height of 10 m, it allows you to soar four metres into the air and enjoy a safe, breathtaking aerial view of the market.

Moments to be shared all around the city

Festive lighting of the shopping districts

From the city centre to Neder-Over-Heembeek, and through to Haren and Laeken, every winter, Brussels becomes a web of light. The shopping streets and avenues abound with original and surprising creations, uniting residents, visitors, and traders in a shared, festive experience.

To explore this urban enchantment, themed walking routes by neighbourhood invite visitors to stroll around Brussels By Lights. Every step becomes an encounter with art, creativity, and conviviality, revealing the capital in a light that is both magical and full of life.

A long-term commitment to sustainable development

Winter Wonders continues its transformation, faithful to a philosophy of experimentation and continuous progress. Each edition allows us to refine concrete actions that combine conviviality, inclusion and environmental responsibility.

For several years now, the event has been moving forward in small but steady steps: reusable cups, LED lighting, reduced electric heating, improved waste sorting and the promotion of Brussels artisans have become sustainable reflexes.

The Christmas tree in the Grand-Place, recycled each year into street furniture, trophies and, this year, barriers, embodies this desire to extend the life of materials and give meaning to every action.

In 2025, a new step will be taken with the arrival of 100% compostable tableware made from sugar cane pulp. Its ease of use, supported by a dedicated collection system, will make it easier for exhibitors and visitors to adopt a more responsible approach.

Sustainable development also has a social dimension.

Training for Winter Wonders staff, prevention protocols and awareness campaigns along the route reinforce a culture of respect and kindness. With more bins, over a hundred sorting points and daily collection and cleaning by City and BME teams, Winter Wonders once again demonstrates the importance it attaches to public cleanliness, in the interests of residents, visitors and traders.

This is not a fixed model, but a living laboratory of sustainable practices, faithful to the spirit of Brussels – inventive, collective and always on the move.



"Winter Wonders should not only be the largest and most convivial Christmas market in the country, but also the cleanest. We are translating this ambition into very concrete actions: our Public Cleanliness department will carry out a thorough cleaning of the entire site every morning, we are introducing an additional evening collection, i.e. a third collection, of public bins in the city centre on the busiest days, and our ticketing unit will work closely with BME to penalise visitors who do not comply with our cleanliness rules. Cleanliness is everyone's business, including during Winter Wonders.

"For this edition of Winter Wonders, we are doing everything we can to make the event as sustainable as possible. Reusable cups are back, but this year they will be collected even more efficiently and washed locally at a washing station on the Heysel site. For plates and bowls, we are switching to a compostable material ('bagasse'), which, like the orange bag from Net Brussels, will be converted into green energy or fertiliser. The reusable tableware trial at the Place de la Bourse has been temporarily suspended, but will be replaced in future by a viable alternative for the whole of Winter Wonders. Our ambition remains to make this winter festival a completely waste-free event in the long term."

To fully enjoy Winter Wonders, active mobility and public transport are preferred, allowing visitors to reach the heart of the event while limiting disruption caused by traffic and end-of-year construction work.

Brussels Central Station, a strategic access point to the city centre, offers a direct connection to the route. SNCB passengers benefit from a 50% discount on return train tickets during the weekend (from Friday 7 p.m. to Sunday), as well as advantageous rates for station car parks. The nearby STIB Central Station also provides access to the market by metro, tram or bus, with lifts ensuring accessibility for all.

Secure bicycle parking is available nearby, particularly at the Bourse and De Brouckère stations. Parking shared scooters and bicycles is prohibited along the route, but dedicated areas are provided nearby.

For those travelling by car, Interparking car parks within walking distance (Rogier, Poelaert, Entre 2 portes,

Loi) are a convenient solution, with attractive evening rates. The Vismet area has limited access during peak hours, with a 'Kiss & Ride' zone for drop-offs. The Park & Ride facilities on the outskirts of the city also offer an alternative, with direct metro links to the city centre.

Accessibility and comfort

The entire route is designed to be accessible to all: adapted toilets, access ramps, secure flooring and cable passages. The ice rink and Ferris wheel have PRM cabins. Families can enjoy a 'Baby Corner' at the Bourse, a comfortable space for changing children and preparing meals or bottles.


